Whaddon School is a smaller than average school. It sits within the picturesque village of Whaddon but is surprisingly close to Milton Keynes. For this reason it is not only used by the children of the village but also attracts families from other local villages and from the outskirts of Milton Keynes.

We provide high quality education for children from the age of 4 until the age of 7. This means our class sizes remain small and we can offer a really personalised learning experience for every child. We prepare them for the next stage of their education in a gentler environment, using a combination of child-led and teacher guided learning. Our high levels of attainment and progress speak for themselves and by the end of their time here, the children are confident, independent learners.

While parents tell me they love the school and are very sad to leave, when the children are ready to move on, there are plenty of options available, many of which we have strong links with and can support you through the process.

#### Wraparound care

Our trained staff run before and after school care from 7.30 in the morning until 5.00pm in the evening. There are a variety of options to suit your families needs, including regular, pre-paid sessions and ad-hoc, pay on the day. The children receive a full breakfast in the morning session and a light snack and drink during late-stayers.

## Learning to Learn

#### **Outdoor Learning**

We are fortunate to be surrounded by fields, farmland and woodland, which provide rich learning environments for everyone. The Foundation Stage children visit Mia's Wood to take part in Forest School sessions and all of our children regularly make use of our own Forest School wild area at the top of the field. There is free-flow inside and outside all day during the Foundation Stage and outdoor learning is an integral part of the curriculum in all of our classes.

#### **Great Foundations**

During your child's first year in school it is vital that they are happy and confident enough to explore the world around them and learn from every experience. Children have amazing ideas and our highly trained staff know how to make the most of these and to nurture them into valuable learning experiences.

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum is based on seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social, Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Mathematicvs
- Understanding the world
- Expressive Arts and Design

The children develop well while also learning the skills of being learners, such as solving problems, working with others, learning from mistakes and endurance.

After Foundation Stage, the children move to Key Stage 1 where they learn in Years 1 and 2. Here, they begin to follow the National Curriculum.

Although Languages are not compulsory until Key Stage 2, we begin teaching French in Foundation Stage and continue to build on this in Years 1 and 2. As a First School, the children stay until the end of year 2. This give them the opportunity to continue to learn in the school they already feel secure and confident in, while they develop their learning even further. Our class sizes are small and this ensures all children feel valued for who they are and all have a chance to shine.

The year 2 children are given more responsibility as the oldest in the school. They eagerly take on the role of prefects and work hard to set good examples to their younger school friends.

#### Learning for all

We work closely with parents to ensure additional educational needs are identified and addressed swiftly. Expert advice from external agencies is used to guide planning and provision to enable good progress and high levels of attainment can be reached by all. Our highly experienced staff are skilled in understanding the needs of all children and in providing the correct balance of support and challenge for them.

If a child shows greater skill, knowledge or experience in a particular aspect of the curriculum, they will be monitored to ensure the level of challenge and expectation is appropriate for them. We are committed to providing experiences beyond the classroom for children to explore their talent and understand the possibilities open to them.

We welcome and celebrate all differences that exist within our school and beyond. Our pupils are educated and informed about the diverse lives that exist within the locality and throughout modern Britain. Compassion and wisdom are the foundations of our attitudes and relationships.

At Whaddon School, the health, safety and well-being of every child are our paramount concern. We listen to our pupils and take seriously what they tell us. Our aim is for children to enjoy their time as pupils in this school. We want to work in partnership with you to help your child achieve their full potential and make a positive contribution.

## **Extended Learning**

#### **Visits and Visitors**

A wide range of visitors give our children experiences beyond their daily lives, such as The Asian Arts company, Diwali visitor, Olympic athletes and even Father Christmas finds a place to park his sleigh! Past trips have included The Sealife Centre, Warwick Castle, Waddesdon, Stowe Manor, Claydon House, the Theatre, the pet shop, the vets, Hindu Temple, Synagogue and many more.

#### **Events**

The children are provided with opportunities to take part in sporting competitions and collaborative learning experiences throughout the year. We take part in celebrating important local events such as the village May Fayre, which has been held since 1811; lambing at the local sheep farm; Christingle; carol singing and Arts Fortnight.

As well as providing wrap-around care, we offer extra-curricular clubs including: computer club, hockey, football, tennis, athletics, Hands up for Jesus, cookery, French, karate and the ever popular Welly club

#### Governors
