Use of Pupil Premium Sept 2011 to July 2012

In the financial year 2011-2012 we were allocated £1464 in Pupil Premium. Funds were used to support a range of academic and wider school life activities and experiences including:

- Reading resources for individual and guided reading
- Subsidy of school trips
- Subsidy of after school clubs

Impact

Year 3 - 100% of Pupil Premium pupils made good or outstanding progress in reading, writing and maths.

Year 2 – All Pupil Premium pupils made good progress from their starting points on entry to the school. 50% achieved level 3 in reading writing and maths.

Year 1 and Reception – No Pupil Premium pupils.

Use of Pupil Premium Sept 2012 to July 2013

In the financial year 2012- 2013 £2492 was received in funding.

Funds are being used to support a range of academic and wider school life activities and experiences including:

- Increased Teaching Assistant hours to give added support to pupil premium children.
- Subsidy of school trips
- Subsidy of after school clubs
- Subsidise purchase of laptops for individual pupils

Impact

Year 3 - 100% of Pupil Premium pupils made good progress in reading, writing and maths. Reception - 100% of Pupil Premium pupils made good or outstanding progress from their starting point on entry to school in all the Early Years areas of development.

Year 1 and 2 - No Pupil Premium Pupils

Use of Pupil Premium Sept 2013 to July 2014

In the financial year 2013-2014 £2506 was received in Pupil Premium funding.

We continued to use these funds to support a wide range of focussed academic support and wider school life activities and experiences including:

- Ongoing additional Teaching Assistant hours to give added support to pupil premium children.
- Subsidy of educational school visits
- Subsidy of after school clubs

Impact

Reception - No Pupil Premium pupils. Year 1 - 100% of Pupil Premium pupils made good progress in reading and maths and are now meeting age related expectations. Year 2 - No Pupil Premium pupils Year 3 - No Pupil Premium pupils

Use of Pupil Premium Sept 2014 to July 2015

In the financial year 2014- 2015 we have been allocated £1600 in Pupil Premium funding.

Funds are being used to support a range of academic and wider school life activities and experiences including:

- Increased Teaching Assistant hours to give added support to pupil premium children.
- Subsidy of school trips
- Subsidy of after school clubs

Impact

Foundation Stage – 2 Pupil Premium Pupils. 100% of pupils achieved a good level of development in all areas of the curriculum.

Year 1-2 Pupil Premium Pupils. 100% of pupils made good progress in reading and writing. 50% made good progress in maths. 50% made outstanding progress in maths. The children are working at age related expectations or have exceeded expectations (50% in maths).

Year 2 - 1 Pupil Premium Pupil. 100% made good progress in maths and are working at age related expectations in this subject.
