Dance Festival



Forest School News

The biggest Forest School news is that the Foundation Stage children have started to take part in Forest School each week! This means that every child in the school spends half a day per week at Forest School, playing, learning and socialising outdoors.

Foundation Stage have spent time getting to know Forest School; they have learnt how to sing the Forest School Song and how to do a Sticky Register. An important aspect of Forest School is being safe; the children have learnt how to do the weekly 'safety sweep' of Forest School to take responsibility for their own safety. They have been introduced to some of the opportunities on offer, such as den building, tree climbing, making potions and hunting for minibeasts. They are already becoming proficient Forest Schoolers.

Class 1 and 2 have joined together for Friday morning sessions. As you may have guessed, 'weather' has been a prominent topic of conversation over the past few sessions! The children are becoming very good at estimating the temperature: they are usually within a few degrees. One session was spent discussing the wind: children talked about which direction it came from, how it was created and how it felt to be in the wind. One child said that his favourite part o the session was feeling the wind on his skin.

On a different note, the children suspect that there may have been a visitor at Forest School: magical glitter was found on the ground. One suggestion was Jack, from Jack and the Beanstalk. The children thought perhaps Jack had climbed down some of the trees, in the absence of the usual beanstalk.


