### **Mantle of the Expert**

#### Percy's Park Keepers.

So far, the children have rescued injured animals, giving them medicine, TLC and bandages, and are in the middle of deciding what to do about a large number of birds whose tree has fallen down. The Year 1 children have been learning a lot about mammals, birds, carnivores, herbivores, omnivores and map making! The Reception children are definitely enjoying their first Mantle and are becoming very good at stepping into the story!



#### The Ancient Oak Tree.

In Squirrel Class this half-term the children became a team of Arboriculturists. They are passionate about an ancient oak tree and the animals that shared their habitats with it. Unfortunately, there was a terrible storm which affected the tree and its inhabitants greatly. Sadly, following the storm, the Mayor of the village declared the tree as a health and safety concern and has insisted the tree be cut down. The villagers (Squirrel class) were outraged by this and are doing everything in their powers to prevent it. Thanks to the research, care and consideration of the arboriculturists the tree may be saved and the animals may survive. There are particular concerns for Scaredy Squirrel who is currently stuck at the top of an unsafe tree with no food. Thankfully the Squirrels managed to design a pulley system, to hoist fresh acorns up to Scaredy Squirrel. The story will continue in November.

#### Roman Legionaries.

This half term the legionaries of Badger Class have been patrolling the northern frontier of the Roman empire. Whilst doing this they have created their own shields and performed manoeuvres, designed a Roman fort, learnt some Latin phrases and started to decipher Roman numerals.
