Learning Outside the Classroom



Squirrels & Badgers

During the Spring term the children in Squirrels and Badgers have had opportunities to complement their learning with experiences outside the classroom. This has included creating artwork for our Mantles using spray paint to create images showing the landscapes that could be seen from the Wadi Rum and the disappearing island.

During the Disappearing Island mantle there have been other chances to learn outside. We explored the different habitats that animals live in. A Science experiment to investigate how far sound will travel also took place.



Squirrel class have enjoyed looking after the new member of their class, Mr Edward Whiskers, the guinea pig who joined them in March. Our World Poetry Day also took place in March, when the children were given the opportunity to plan and write poems based on elements of the outside areas of the school.

Finally, the children from Squirrels and Badgers enjoyed a return trip to Waddesdon Manor, where one of the activities was an orienteering course. This helped to teach the children the skill of reading a map accurately and allowed them to explore the grounds of the Manor in spring sunshine.

Mantle of the Expert

The Last Mammoth: Hedgehog Class

Hedgehog Class have been on a long journey since January. They started off by becoming a team of expert elephant keepers; they found out all about how to care for elephants, created an enclosure to meet their needs and took care of them. Then they were approached by an archaeologist who had discovered a cave painting (around 10,000 years old) which she thought was of an elephant - hence contacting our team. However, the team did some research and discovered the painting was actually of a woolly mammoth. Upon hearing this, the archaeologist tasked them with travelling to the Ice Age and saving the last mammoth from extinction. A few weeks later, and the children succeeded in their mission, learning a lot about the Ice Age as they went. When we discussed our story

afterwards, the children had lot of good memories, such as creating Ice Age Animal spotting guides, finding the best natural material to cure Ewan's leg (bitten by a sabre toothed cat), or learning all about the diets of huntergatherers.



Who was Beatrix Potter? Year 2

Beginning with an old photograph of a cheerful lady and man and a dog, we discovered that this was Beatrix Potter and her brother. She grew up with a love of nature and a talent for drawing. As a female, she wasn't allowed to be a scientist and men would read her papers instead of her.

She loved the Lake District and some investigative work was carried out to find out what life was like there and how it has changed since the Victorian times.

As scientists, we have carried out our own experiments with plants, and even planned and planted a garden for Mr McGregor! We created our own Beatrix Potter style books as well. We will miss Beatrix. She is a very inspirational person!

Disappearing Island: Years 3 and 4

This term the team of Scientists from Badger Class have been exploring the reasons why an island has disappeared from satellite imagery. To be able to discover the reasons we have had to conduct experiments involving several different areas of science—Electricity, Magnetism and Sound. This has helped us to uncover, along with the support of Scientists from Year 3 the reasons behind the mystery, along with uncovering new species of animals, and meeting secret agents from different countries!

World Book Day and Waterstones

World Book Day was, as always, a lot of fun. The theme was '25 Years of World Book Day' so the teachers gathered a box of 25 wonderful children's books to read throughout the day. The children took part in three workshops: a book-making workshop, a T-shirt making workshop (by far the most popular!) and a challenge to design a new front cover for a book. As part of the celebrations, the children were invited to visit Waterstones in Milton



Keynes. Our host was Nikki Bloomer, a long-time friend and previous teacher at the school. She hosted four groups from school to experience a tour of the store and an inside look at how a book shop runs. The children all had a lovely time and we hope to go again for other book-related events. Thank you Mrs Bloomer!



Poetry Day

During one of our Wednesday meetings, the children in Squirrel class put forward the idea of holding a poetry day. We all thought this was a good idea and, as it happened, World Poetry Day was just a couple of weeks later; which is how, on Tuesday 22nd March (a day after the actual date) the whole school ended up having a very poetry-filled day.

Each class was set the challenge of learning a poem by heart to perform. That afternoon the whole school gathered on the sunny hill to watch the performances. Hedgehog Class performed 'The Lion Roars with a Fearful Sound' by Mabel Segun, complete with actions. Next up was Year 2 with a rendition of 'On the Ning Nang Nong' by Spike Milligan. Finally Years 3 and 4 performed Down to Earth by Benjamin Zephaniah.

Each class also learnt how to write their own poetry using various techniques depending on their age group. Finally (a special request from the children) the whole school worked together on some out-

door poetry. Each group of children (mixes of all the age groups) were given an outdoor object to spend time with. They gathered adjectives, verbs and similes relating to their object, before having a go at writing a poem in whatever style they wished.

It was a lovely day - helped by the sun - and the children decided they'd like another poetry day again sometime.
