To begin with the whole school gathered together to welcome him. They sang songs and learnt a poem: **This family started small, but now it's the biggest family of all!** The children were amazed to learn that there are Christians in almost every country in the world.

Following this, each class spent some time with John to find out more. They used a globe to identify countries where Christianity could be found. Finally, they heard the story of a little bird who travelled from his own church in England to churches around the world: he discovered that although the churches and people were all different, they were all part of one big family.

The following day, Class 1 and Class 2 produced some posters about churches in different countries. They used photographs of the buildings, locations and people to identify similarities and differences: the most important similarities included: 'They pray to God,' 'They are reading the Bible,' and 'They believe in God.'

We are Whaddon Art Gallery

At the beginning of term the whole school became artists to create a 'We are Whaddon' art gallery. The theme of the art was 'I am special' and each child thought about what was special and unique about themselves.

In Foundation Stage the children looked at the art of L.S. Lowry. They created salt dough figures of themselves in his style. The Year 1 children focussed on Paul Klee. Their art work consisted of small images in the background showings things that were important to them (family, pets, favourite food, sports and so on). In the centre of their art work they produced a black and white portrait of themselves. In Class 2 the focus was on Mexican folk art including a portrait by Frida Kahlo. Using this and other folk art images, the children produced some beautifully detailed portraits of themselves using colour and pattern.

To accompany their art work, each child wrote about themselves and what was special about them. If you have not yet had a chance to see the art gallery, please do so: the children have worked incredibly hard and produced some outstanding art work.
