We also got to wear a tallit which is a special shawl for Shabbat. We enjoyed learning about Judaism.

Class Two's Visit to Milton Keynes Hindu Association

In our first full week back we got onto a coach and went on a trip to see a Hindu temple. We were excited, as we remembered our Diwali day with Mrs Wright and we were looking forward to learning more about all the different gods we knew Hindus believed in. When we arrived, some of us were surprised by the building, as it didn't look much like a temple from the outside. The people at the centre explained to us that the MKHA is much more than a place of worship and the temple is actually inside the building. We took off our shoes at the entrance, which symbolised us leaving behind all of our worries and any unhappiness, as we were entering the house of God. Inside we learnt a lot about the ways and beliefs of Hindus. We joined in their prayer and joined in a pledge to try and do one kind thing every day to help make the world a better place. Pledges ranged from tidying our rooms without being asked to, being kinder to our brothers and sisters, or telling a joke to someone who looked sad. The staff at the centre let us ask lots of questions and even sang us some songs. It was an interesting trip and a great opportunity for the children to recognise some of their RE learning in action.

Turtle Watch in Year 1 and Year 2

This half term Year 1 and Year 2 have been Turtle Watch. Everybody had a turtle which they named and measured on Mombasa Beach. Then we added a tracker to the turtles.

Each week we checked our turtle tracker to see where our turtles were and where they were going. We have learnt the names of oceans and compass directions to do this.

We talked to Chief Kekepania, from Honu Island. She was sad that no turtles came to the island any more. She hadn't seen any for nine or ten years! She wanted our help to find out why. She wanted more turtles to come to the beach.

We visited Honu Island and then wrote some persuasive letters for them with ideas for how to help the turtles to come, like: move the hotels, stop the boats for a little while and make a special beach for the turtles. We also explained that the turtles had to come to Honu Island because with no honus (turtles) it can't be Honu Island.

One of our turtles was found with straws stuck in him and his flippers caught in a net. Luckily, he was rescued by a fisherman and taken to the vets.






